CASE STUDY DESIGN



Case study design

1. Case study methodology
2. Qualitative research
3. Semi-structured focus group discussion and key informant interviews: Members and non-members (women and men separately), the management, local authorities, extension services, observers.
4. Debriefing locally and at state level.
5. Analysis

CASE SELECTION



Case selection

- CSBs managed by its members directly or elected committees: **2 CSBs**
- CSBs managed by self-help groups (all together 54 mapped CSBs) :**1 CSB**
- CSBs managed by an individual/household: **1 CSB**
- CSBs managed by FPO: **1CSB**
